13. Ocean sciences Capacity Building (Key collaborators, START, SCOR, DBCB, IMBER)

The Node manager received funds from START (Global Change Systems for Analysis Research and Training), as well as the ASCLME and in kind contributions from the UCT oceanography department to run a week long ocean modelling course in 2009. Following on from this a number of students have gone on to apply for PhDs in modelling at UCT. The Node manager was also invited to lecture at the Data Buoy Capacity Building inaugural workshop in Cape Town. This will be an ongoing project with workshops run each year and is in collaboration with the South African Weather Service and NOAA.
