

## Monthly Update JULY 2010

## **Key Achievements in July**

## Algoa Bay LTMR

- Shaun Deyzel serviced the offshore UTR Port Alfred (80m) on the 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2010, data was retrieved and a new unit launched successfully.
- o PE-LTEMP monthly field trip was carried out on the 4<sup>th</sup> July 2010.
- Shaun facilitated talks toward finalising sampling site layout for PE-LTEMP with monitoring P.I.'s. Six sampling sites, focusing on a coastal monitoring mandate was agreed upon by all parties concerned.
- New zooplankton flow meters was received.
- Back-up HOBO temperature probes for Gully Probe and UTR arrays was also received.

## Data Management

- Mr Gavin Fleming, SAEON Information Management Scientist, spent two days, 19-20 July 2010, working with various members of the Elwandle team, to improve data acquisition and management.
- Elwandle Node now has representatives, Shaun Deyzel and Bruce Donovan, who are registered to upload relevant data to respective portals. These include Metacat, CoGIS and the Nairobi Convention, South African Clearinghouse.
- Sentinel Site *in situ* data were delegated to Mr Rowen Van Eeden a SAEON registered MSc student (Fitzpatrick Unit, UCT), which will form an integral part of his research programme. Shaun has put him in contact with Dr. Wayne Goschen who will provide Rowen with statistical support.

- Manufacture on board zooplankton sample filtration system.

- Service coastal gully temperature probes.
- Continue with research programme registration.
- Start uploading data to Metacat and Nairobi Convention portals.

### South African Estuaries Information System (SAEIS)

- During July most of the administrative work for the SAEIS was completed with release agreement forms being sent to key stakeholder organisations to obtain permission for the inclusion of their reports on the SAEIS. At present, Nuette Gordon is still waiting for replies from a number of these organizations, and hope to have these by early August.
- An assistant for Nuette was employed for July to help with the typing of front-pages for all the reports to be included on the SAEIS. Ms. Kristen Ellis was employed for 51



hours and accomplished an amazing amount of work during that time. Unfortunately, due to the large amount of documents currently on the SAEIS, she was not able to complete all the front-pages during this period. At present, splicing these front-pages to each document and finalizing the SAEIS will be her main focus.

- Nuette is still awaiting metadata for GIS shapefiles for inclusion on the SAEIS. It is hoped that these will be completed by the respective researchers by mid to late August.
- Nuette had a meeting with Gavin Flemming regarding the format and requirements for the metadata to be included on the SAEON data portal for the SAEIS. She will have ongoing meetings with Dr. Wayne Goschen on the population of the portal with the Estuaries database.
- She will also liaise with Dr. Goschen regarding the website design and layout to be launched during September / October 2010.
- Nuette has relocated to Cape Town for personal reasons, which is ideal for frequent meetings with Dr. Goschen regarding the Estuaries database.

- o 3-6 August she will complete the splicing of front-pages to documents.
- The 9 13 August she will process the returned release agreements;
- Focus on Web-design, and

- o Transfer data to the SAEON portal & testing of the SAEIS.
- o The 23 27 August she will test the website, and
- o Format the DVD series of the SAEIS.

### Marine Protected Areas:

- Sean Bailey was mainly focused on working on the 2010 data for iSimangaliso for July.
- He is currently on the Tsitsikamma National Park (TNP) fieldtrip with Anthony Bernard and Dr. Albrecht Götz which started on the 21<sup>st</sup> July and is expected to last until mid August.

- He also participated in the successful mooring of uKwabelana in the Storms River gorge.

- The mapping by the council for geoscience at TNMP is ongoing.

### National Science Week 2010

- > The launch of NSW was held in Alice at Fort Hare University on the 29<sup>th</sup> July 2010
- ➤ It was well attended, over 4500 people were present including dignitaries of the Departments of Education and Science and Technology, learners, educators, parents, university staff, students and science exhibitors from across the country.
- The theme for NSW was *The role of science in economic development* and a number of companies, institutes and universities exhibited the ways in which their science makes a contribution to economic development.
- ➤ The Makana district was well represented with 6 exhibitions including the South African Environmental Observation Network (SAEON), the South African Institute for Aquatic Biodiversity (SAIAB), SAIAB's education outreach programme, Bright Sparks, Upstart, which is Grahamstown's official youth newspaper, Rhodes University's Pharmacy Department and the Albany Museum.
