

Monthly Update OCTOBER 2010

Key Achievements in October

Algoa Bay LTMR

- Shaun Deyzel serviced the 30m UTR at Bird Island, Woody Cape and Cape Recife. Also serviced ADCP at Cape Recife on the 10th & 21st October 2010.
- PE-LTEMP monthly field trip was successfully carried out on the 31st October 2010. A full complimentary set of parameters were sampled at 6 coastal monitoring sites.
- o Dr. Matt Dickon carried out his monthly fieldtrip to Bird Island on the 27th October.
- Shaun had a meeting with Dr Wayne Goschen with regards to expanding CMP footprint to St Francis Bay. 3 UTR and 5 Gully Temperature Probes are expected to be deployed before the end of the year.

South African Estuaries Information System (SAEIS)

- It is an ongoing process awaiting replies from the stakeholder organizations. Both Nuette Gordon and Dr. Paterson has sent out requests for the return hereof but key stakeholders have still not responded.
- Dr. Wayne Goschen has updated the website version of the SAEIS to test whether all components are functioning correctly. Nuette has also tested the site and suggested a few changes to Dr. Goschen, who is currently working on that.
- It was hoped to launch the 1st version of the SAEIS website by the 31st October 2010 but due to the delays of obtaining the software license from the supplier and the return of the release forms the launch has been postponed.
