Monthly Update NOVEMBER 2010

### Key Achievements in November

#### Algoa Bay LTMRP

- UTR Bird Island inner, UTR Woody Cape and UTR Bay Mouth were retrieved and new units redeployed on 3 November. UTR Central (60m) was retrieved on the same day and redeployed on 30 November.
- UTR Sundays washed ashore on Thursday the 4<sup>th</sup> November, which was presumably dislodged after a large swell event which affected that part of Algoa Bay between 30 October and 2 November. Data was successfully secured and the unit was redeployed on Friday, 5<sup>th</sup> November.
- o Dr. Matt Dickon carried out his monthly fieldtrip to Bird Island on the 20<sup>th</sup> November.
- PE-LTEMP monthly sampling was carried out on the 23<sup>rd</sup> November.
- UTR Port Alfred inner (30m) and UTR Port Alfred outer (80m) were serviced on 23 November. Data were successfully retrieved and units re-deployed on the same day.
- UTR St Croix and the surface HOBO sensors on Bell Buoy reef were successfully serviced on 30 November.
- Servicing requirements for all Continuous Monitoring Platforms are up to date.
