II. Achievements: August 2012

1. Management, Student and Staff Relations

- 2 August: Tommy presented a SAEON presentation at the DST National Science Week Public Presentations at BayWorld, Port Elizabeth; titled: Long Term Ecological Research (LTER) in Algoa Bay and associated estuaries.
- 6 August: Tommy attended a meeting with Prof Martin Hill to expand the parataxonomy laboratory and finalise the SAEON / RU MoU.
- 7 August: Tommy attended the Ocean Acidification meeting with ASCLME and CSIR in Grahamstown.
- 8 August: Tommy held a meeting with Prof Sheona Shackleton from the Department of Environmental Science, RU, regarding a proposal to conduct social studies and the impact of climate change on communities in the Transkei.

2. Monitoring Platforms

a. Algoa Bay LTMRP

- 14 August: Monthly PE-LTEMRP plankton sampling conducted successfully.
- 22-23 August: NMMU collaborators (PE-LTEMRP) conducted Primary Productivity experiments in Algoa Bay.
- 23 August: UTR's CEN, Bay Mo, BI Inner & Outer serviced. SAEON dive team assisted with final retrieval of Primary Productivity experimental arrays at 5 locations in Algoa Bay.
- 23 August: ADCP CR was removed & ADCP BI serviced. The ADCP CR mooring was badly damaged, preventing the re-deployment of the ADCP at this site. A dedicated dive operation will determine the extent of the damage, during which time repairs will be made before deployment of the ADCP.
- 24 August: Annual PE-LTEMRP workshop held at NMMU with Tommy and Shaun in attendance. Progress for sampling year 2012 was presented and the way forward discussed. Action points and deliverables were circulated to participants on 28 August.

c. Estuaries LTMRP

3. Marine Protected Areas

- 7-14 August: Denham Parker attended an ecological modelling course titled "Numerical ecology" held by Dr David Kaplan at the Department of Ichthyology and Fisheries Science, Rhodes University.
- Anthony Bernard produced a proposal for his Post-doctoral research programme which
 focuses on employing novel stereo-BRUV techniques for long term monitoring in five
 MPA's.
- Progress has been made in data exploration for Denham Parker's PhD.

- 24 August: PE-LTEMRP project registration and data management was discussed with collaborators of the programme. Shaun Deyzel will compile a proposal document wherein the strategy for effective management and dissemination of data as well as the structure of project registration will be outlined. Document will be ready for distribution by 28 September.

6. Parataxonomy Laboratory

Parataxonomy Laboratory staff members, Mr Mpako and Mr Poni are continuing with the
analysis of ORI benthic samples. Analysis of these samples is nearing completion and we
are very pleased with their continued support in the laboratory.
