# 5. Education

# 6. Parataxonomy Laboratory

- 8 May: Shaun met with Lasec representative Ms Remi Barnard to discuss Microscope maintenance plans and purchasing options.
- A total of 55 PE-LTEMRP zooplankton samples were processed for biomass determination.

# 7. Technical: CMP Maintenance/SCUBA Diving/Boating

- 15 May: A lost acoustic release unit and VR2 unit (SAIAB) was found and returned to SAEON.

- Spares for the moored CTD arrived but the wrong I/O cable was sent. This was returned to FRS and we are awaiting the exchange.
- R/V Honckenii is in for repairs after the port starter motor failed on CMP trip at sea.

# 8. Research support / platform provision

# a. Joint ACEP Marine Platform Operations

Favourable weather during May allowed for all of the required work on R/V *uKwabelana* to be completed for the month. This included:

- SAEON Monthly Plankton Run
- SAEON CMP servicing



- ACEP Shark tagging trip (on which 7 great whites were tagged at Bird Island!)
- ACEP Leery tagging at the harbour wall
- ACEP Phuhlisa Microbiology project fish collection
- The ROV was also very active this month as it was used in Sodwana Bay as part of the Multi-National, Multi-institutional Gombessa Expedition which was comprised of researchers, divers and videographers from SAIAB, SANBI, the National History Museum in France and Andromede Oceanologie. The ROV did 21 dives in various canyons in the Isimangaliso Wetland Park off the M/V Angra Pequena.

# b. SAIAB-ACEP/SAEON/UFH/WSU Collaboration

- 16 & 29 May: Shaun met with Dr Francesca Porri for further discussion of two Phuhlisa research projects.
- 21-26 May: Shaun co-lead a fieldtrip to the Mgazana Estuary for data collection related to 2 Phuhlisa research projects. Team leaders included Dr Francesca Porri (SAIAB/ACEP Phuhlisa) and Dr Jackie Hill (Botany Department, Rhodes University).
- 24 May: YSI, Secchi disk, light meter and Niskin bottle lent to Mr Ryan Palmer (SAIAB/ACEP) for estuarine fieldtrip.

All three interns intend to pursue careers in science and have identified this as the area requiring significant improvement.

# 9. Challenges and corrective measures

• Winter is approaching thus reducing the number of available sea days. Mitigation: Considerable use will be made of R/V *Honckenii* during the good sea days to relieve pressure on R/V *uKwabelana*.

# 10. Risks description, impacts and mitigation

• The loss of a 30 m thermistor string at Port Alfred is a concern because it is the second string lost in the area. Divers will be sent to the area to determine if the mooring is lost or if the acoustic release is faulty. If the mooring is no longer there then we attempts will be made to find the string and buoys washed up on the beaches upstream of the longshore drift. The original mooring site was deemed unsafe due to fishing activity.
