#### II. Achievements: August 2013

#### 1. Management, Student and Staff Relations

#### 2. Monitoring Platforms

#### a. Algoa Bay LTMRP

- We were not able to conduct the monthly PE-LTER sampling this month due to unfavourable weather conditions. Swell size averaged between 3 and 4 metres in height, at times reaching 6 m or more.
- 5 August: Elwandle Node in collaboration with NMMU submitted applications for sampling permits for the following projects to be run within the confines of the Addo Elephant National Park MPA:
  - o Algoa Bay Sentinel Site Continuous Monitoring Platform (CMP) active
  - Algoa Bay Pelagic Ecosystem LTERP (PE-LTERP) active
  - o Algoa Bay Rocky Shore and Subtidal Reef LTERP (RSSR-LTERP) proposed



- Algoa Bay Sandy Beaches LTERP (SB-LTERP) active
- 5 August: UTR's BI inner and outer, 60m Central & 80m Algoa Mouth were serviced by Sean Bailey and Athi Mfikili.
- 6 August: Tommy, Shaun Deyzel and Sean Bailey attended the inaugural Sentinel Site Operations meeting held at SAIAB. SAIAB participants included Dr Angus Paterson, Dr Paul Cowley (OTN/ATAP), Ryan Palmer (ACEP Technical Officer) and Koos Smith (Skipper)
- 7 August: Shaun met with Dr Charles von der Meden (Egagasini Node) and Ryan Palmer to discuss sampling logistics for a pilot study of the Offshore Benthic LTERP. Field work for this pilot study was initially planned for the period 26 August 6 September, but had to be rescheduled due to a faulty outboard motor on R/V uKwabelana and the boat is reported to be unavailable for fieldwork until mid-September. The use of alternative vessels for all sea-based work during this time is being discussed in-house.

#### 4. Data Management

#### 6. Parataxonomy Laboratory

Biomass analysis of zooplankton samples collected for the PE-LTERP is now up to date.
 Biomass database was updated and a series of preliminary data analyses were performed for reporting of general spatio-temporal trends to the PE-LTERP research group.



- Parataxonomy Technicians have started with the analysis of sediment samples collected from the Orange River Estuary/Delta area. They will continue with this analysis for the remainder of the year until the next round of Vleesbaai benthic samples (SAEON Egagasini Node) arrive early December.
- Tommy submitted a 2 page brief of the Parataxonomy Laboratory to the Member of Parliament Hon Mocumi that will be read as a statement to the house.

  the vessel will be back on the water shortly.

#### 10.Challenges and corrective measures

• Bad weather resulted in the cancellation of the monthly plankton field trip. It is accepted that a month or two will be missed per annum due to unfavourable seas. First opportunity in September will be used to obtain samples as close to August as possible.



#### 11. Risks description, impacts and mitigation

• Engine failure on R/V uKwabelana meant that the vessel was out of commission for 3 weeks. Luckily the weather was also foul at the same time so no sea days were lost. SAIAB replaced the two motors with new ones, so this risk has been mitigated. The refurbishment of R/V Kadouw will also mitigate the risk of engine failure in one vessel impacting on LTER.
