# **Key Achievements in January**

### Algoa Bay LTMR

- In situ equipment in place and operational.
- Meeting with Prof Campell to design her phytoplankton programme completed
- Dr Dickens (Bay World) has joined the site and is doing great White Monitoring
- Dr Picheu (UCT Percy Fitzpatrick) has joined the site and is doing penguin monitoring.

#### Marine Protected Areas:

### Isimangaliso

- Sean Bailey submitted an interim report on the 9<sup>th</sup> December to the Isimangaliso project collaborator.
- Sean worked on the benthic invertebrates in January and is currently awaiting the invert identification results from Cape Town.

### Tsitsikamma National Park

During December 2009, Dr Albrecht Gotz and Anthony Bernard finalised the collaborative research project with Marine and Coastal Management and SAIAB to conduct a survey of the deep-water reefs during the July-August 2010 field trip.



- In December 2009, they arranged for MCM to map the deep- water reefs within the survey area, which subsequently has been done by MCM during January 2010.
- Since the 22<sup>nd</sup> January until the 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2010, Albrecht and Anthony will be on the Tsitsikamma National Park Summer field trip.

#### Table Mountain National Park

- During December 2009, Dr Albrecht Götz and Anthony Bernard finalised the contract with Council for geosciences to map the reefs within the target survey areas around the Cape Peninsula.
- During the same month, they arranged for an intern from Montpellier, France to assist them on the project as a part of her overseas studies and enlisted the assistance of volunteers to dive and collect comparative data for them.
- During January, they focused on planning their research priorities for 2010.

#### ACEP:

- O Dr Thomas Bornman participated in and successfully completed 3 cruises during December 2009 starting on the 1<sup>st</sup> 20<sup>th</sup> December with the ACEP & MCM mooring cruise on the R/V *Algoa*. He also participated in the Seamounts cruise on the R/V *Dr Fridtjof Nansen* from the 1<sup>st</sup> 20<sup>th</sup> December and the LOCO mooring cruise on the R/V Algoa from the 10<sup>th</sup> 25<sup>th</sup> December.
- The equipment and samples from the Seamounts cruise were offloaded and stored at SAIAB on the 21<sup>st</sup> December.



- The 14<sup>th</sup> January 2010 samples were loaded on the R/V *Algoa* in Port Elizabeth. Sailing orders were also finalized for the Natal Bight cruise during this period.
- On the 15<sup>th</sup> January fish samples collected during the ASCLME cruises were transported by Dr Bornman from Bayworld to SAIAB for preservation.
- The 18<sup>th</sup> 19<sup>th</sup> January Dr. Bornman attended a SAEON/ACEP planning meeting in Grahamstown.
- On the 19<sup>th</sup> January he met with Professor Campbell regarding the Algoa Bay LTR.
- The 20<sup>th</sup> January Dr Bornman had a meeting with Professor Booth to discuss the Biodiversity project.
- The 22<sup>nd</sup> January he had a meeting with ASCLME to discuss progress and plans for the year ahead.

#### Harbours:

- o December 2009, Shaun Deyzel has submitted 7 winter reports to TNPA.
- In January 2010, he supervised the initial draft of Integrated Summary Report for Ports 2007 – 2009, drafted by Ryan Palmer. Shaun amended and finalized the report for submission.
- He responded to comments from the TNPA ports managers on the Winter 2009 reports.
